This second Cosy Nook of 2023 is dedicated to processes of collective creation and organisation, what Donna Haraway's calls 'Sympoiesis'. Two improvised duos and a trio making with and responding to place, sometimes involving live moving images. Stevie and Els will play together, hurdy-gurdy and projected light. Maureen and Stevie will meet for the 2nd time since their first encounter at Wintersound Festival in Canterbury (Jan. 2023). The three will come together at some point. Els may also chose to intervene elsehwere in the house, studio or garden.
